Geographic Information Science for Environmental and Spatial Planning (GISESP) is a transatlantic consortium of three academic institutions: University of Cagliari, Italy, Department of Environment and Engineering, Urban and Environmental Planning, University of London, UK – Department of Geography, Environmental and Development Studies, and George Mason University, USA – Department of Geography and Geoinformation Science.

GISESP provides students with a dual degree masters' graduate program that will last two years and be based upon successful completion of 48 US credits, equivalent to 144 EU credits leading to the following two degrees: the Master of Science in Geography and Cartography from GMU, US, and the II level Master Degree in Geographic Information and Environmental Planning Support from UniCA, Italy.

GISESP is funded through the Atlantis Program in the period 2010-2014. Forty-eight students and eight faculties in transatlantic mobility are expected to be supported by the program.

The Consortium will provide prospective candidates with the opportunity to experience an integrated program of study in the areas of Geographic Information Science (GIS) and environmental planning support science.
